PARIS is a three years project financed with the support of the ERASMUS + Programme of the European Union - Strategic Partnership in the field of Higher Education.

The project aims to strengthen University's curriculum in the field of refugee management, through the creation of a closer linkage between not for profit organizations active in the field and the academic sector.

Thanks to the realization of 4 Intellectual Outputs and based on investigative activities targeted to the identification of learning needs and the production of innovative teaching tools, the partnership will achieve the recognition of a Joint Curriculum to be piloted during a Summer School, in 2019.

FIRST INTELLECTUAL OUTPUT

During the first phase, 8 months long, all the partners will be engaged in carrying out an intense data collection activity, both at academic and NGOs sector level, in the attempt to:

1. Undertake a mapping of all sectors involved in refugee management assistance, among which NGOs, Public Institutions working for refugees and asylum seekers, as well as Universities listing graduate and post graduate higher education courses focused on migration and refugees;
2. Conduct evidence based research through organizing focus groups in each of the participating countries, with respondents from among the stakeholders identified through the previous mapping exercise, with the aim to wider investigate learning needs of each professional and social category involved;
3. Develop a questionnaire to be administered to all stakeholders identified during the mapping activity, with the aim of investigating learning needs involving a larger sample;
4. Data analysis and production of the First Intellectual Output, entitled: "**Publication on refugee's management approaches currently used the three partner countries**".
